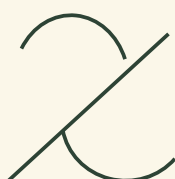

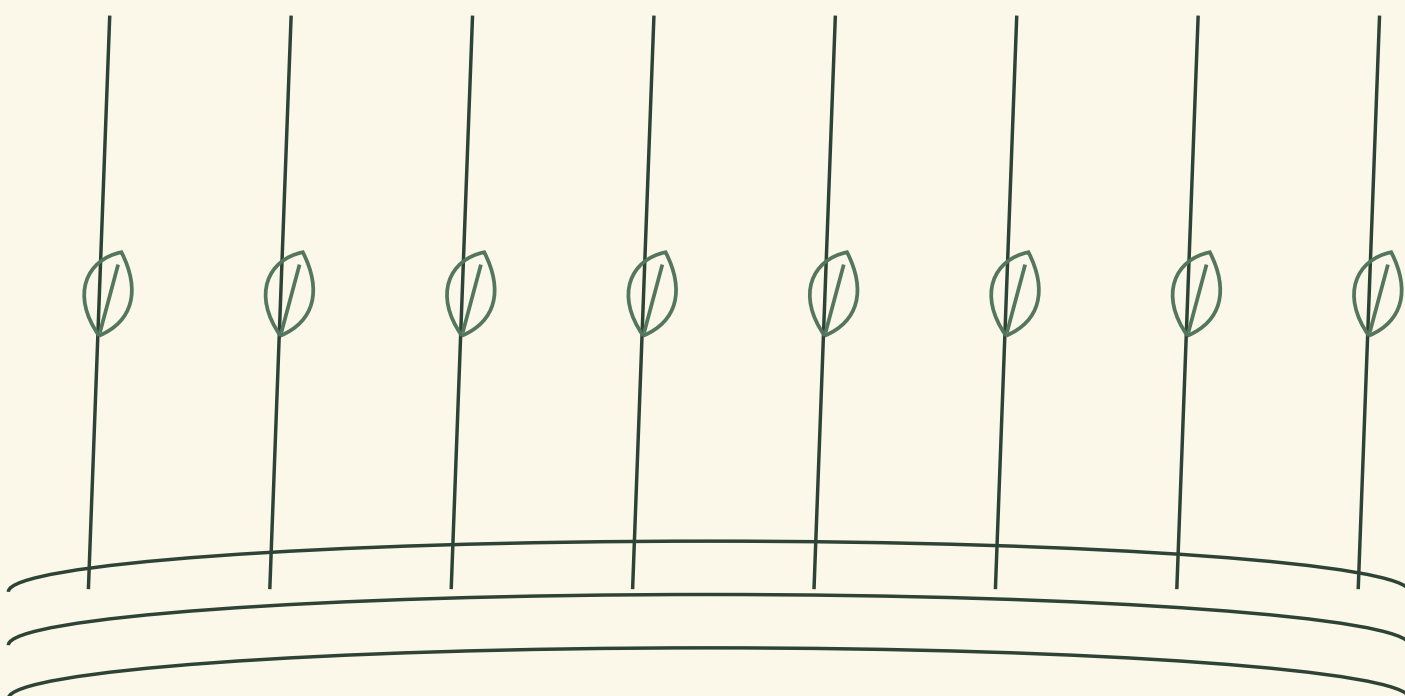
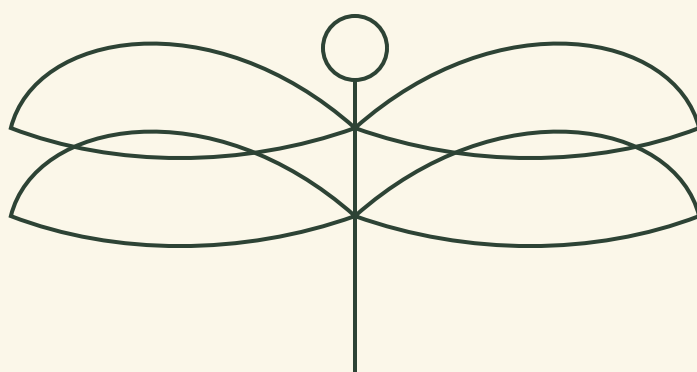


Returns goodness to the soil

Colour the habitat, then notice what every dragonfly needs.

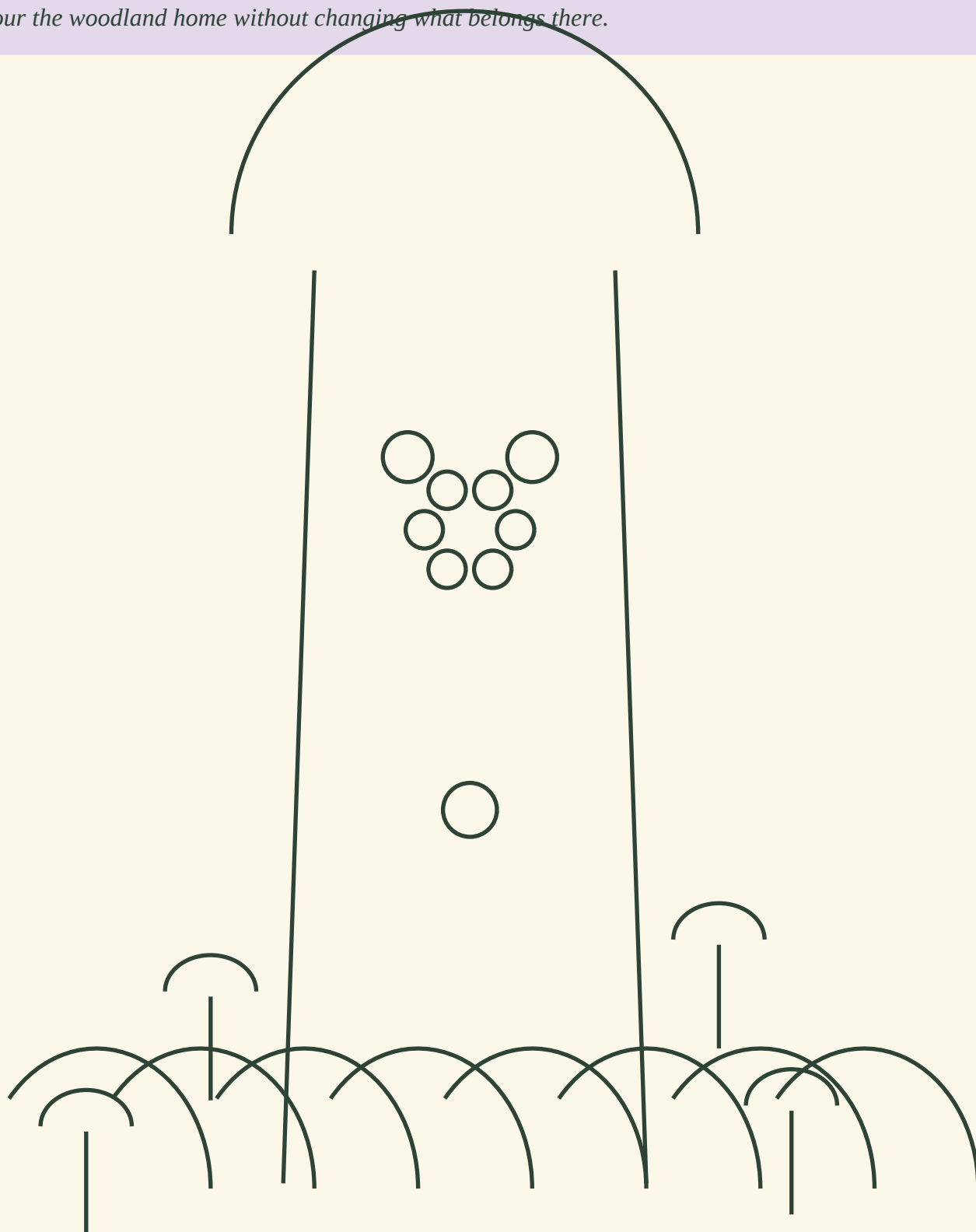


Dragonflies need clean water, water plants, resting places and space to fly.
